## BE PART OF LFCC IMPACT \*

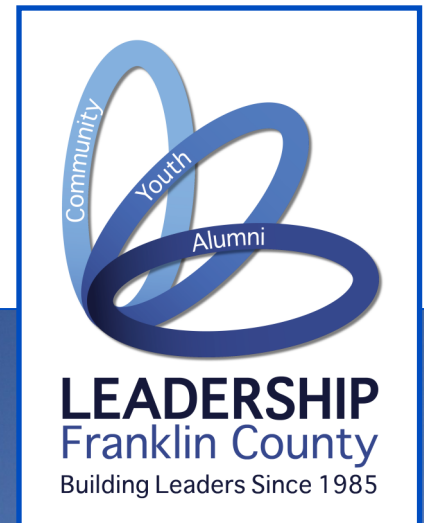
- LFCC students build on average over **74 new business contacts** including 38+faculty members, 12 steering committee members, 17+ facility and mentoring partners
- LFCC classes have on average **15-17 unique companies** representing on average **7 unique segments of business.**
- LFCC students come from all parts of the county with on average **8 different 'home towns'** represented.
- **LFCC students get 108+hrs of programming:** 64 in session, 6 in group receptions, 8 hours in session prep and 3 hours per month in community service project work.
- **630+ area LFCC graduates** since 1985
